AEG Meeting August 21, 2018: Carole Fernandez, President Alachua County League of Women Voters



Carole Fernandez, President of the Alachua County League of Women Voters on Tuesday night, August 21, 2018 spoke to the Altrusa Evening Group. Carole is a retired Assistant U.S. Attorney who handled civil litigation in Miami. The League is nonpartisan. Its website lwvalachua.org and members provide education for Florida voters.

She went over the proposed (13) thirteen amendments to the Florida Constitution, the two (2) Alachua County Referendums and the two (2) City of Gainesville Referendums.

Susan B. Anthony Luncheon



Altrusa International of Gainesville President, Karen Wishart, and other members were at the Susan B. Anthony luncheon on August 25, 2018, celebrating the **170th anniversary of the women's rights convention in Seneca Falls, New York in 1848** and the 98th anniversary of the Nineteenth Amendment to the U.S. Constitution (woman suffrage) 1920. The 2018 Recipient of Friends of Susan B. Anthony Award was Dr. Gwendolyn Zoharah Simmons, Assistant Professor in the Department of Religion, University of Florida, for her work in the areas of civil rights in the U.S as well as international human rights and peace.

Literacy Committee 2018-2019 "Partners in Education Program"

On August 28, 2018 Sarah Stone and Amy Brown, co-chairs of the Altrusa Literacy Committee met with Mrs. **Zeller, Principal of Terwilliger Elementary. The Alachua County Public Schools "Partners in Education Program" agreement was signed.** The purpose of the Partners in Education Program is to strengthen the educational process through collaborative relationships between schools and the community. The Altrusa **Literacy Committee's and the club will focus in 2018-2019** on:

1. Providing **Volunteer Mentors** to improve the reading skills especially for 2nd and 3rd graders. There are four 2nd grade classes and five 3rd grade classes. Each class has approximately 20 students. The mentoring sessions would be an hour and half in length. They would be scheduled between 8:45 and noon. These essential learning opportunities would be one-on-one with a student requiring tutoring in reading. This would be on-going throughout the school year. **"You will be listening to a student read aloud to you and then will discuss the book together for comprehension or word remembrance"**
2. **Book Fair Volunteers.** Fall and Spring
3. **Teacher Appreciation.** Altrusa will provide the 50 teachers, including staff, with a luncheon and opportunity to win gift certificates to local merchants donated by Altrusa members and/or merchants sometime in May 2019. TBD
4. **Monthly Thank You Small Gifts** (Candy bars, etc.) for the teachers showing how much they are appreciated by the community and Altrusa.
5. **Scholastic Books for Honor Roll Student.** Altrusa will purchase Scholastic Readers to be distributed quarterly to each honor roll student.
6. **School supplies.** Terwilliger teachers and their classrooms need crayons, colored pencils and individual pencil sharpeners. Altrusa members can bring these items to each luncheon and AEG meeting for delivery to Terwilliger.

The next Literacy Committee meeting will be Saturday September 22, 2018 at 2 PM at Altrusa House.

Altrusa Scholarship Program at Santa Fe College

Altrusa has an endowed scholarship program to assist women attending Santa Fe College. These scholarships are for women 25 or over who seek to change direction, pursue new career opportunities or who need to enter or reenter the job market after raising a family. We are honoring our Santa Fe Scholarship recipients (four this year) at the September 13, 2018 luncheon meeting. Cheryl Calhoun, the Dean of Access & Inclusion at Santa Fe College will be the speaker and be present to award the scholarships. Cheryl's professional career includes working as a systems analyst, non-profit management, and co-owner of Wild Iris Books, a feminist bookstore. Her research interests focus on broadening participation in computing and challenging gendered norms in gendered fields.

The 2018-2019 Scholarship Recipients:

Maria Marks: “In order to help people, I am pursuing a degree in Psychology. Once I complete my AA in **Psychology at Santa Fe, I plan on transferring to the University of Florida to complete my bachelor's degree. After completing my bachelor's degree, I plan to continue my education to receive my Psy.D in clinical** psychology. Throughout my education, I plan on volunteering with local mental health facilities, such as the Alachua County Crisis Center. Eventually, I plan on opening my own clinical psychology practice and organizing within the community to raise awareness and destigmatize mental health issues. In order to heal the world, we first need to heal ourselves. I believe that it is my calling, to be a positive and constructive **force for healing, amongst individuals and the world as a whole.**”

Robin Roberts: “**My Educational goals are to get the required courses I need in order to transfer to UF and get my Master's degree in Athletic Training. I have been working hard for that goal and will continue to strive** for that dream. Fitness and healthy living is my passion. I'm 62 years old and I work out 4 times a week and ride my bike anywhere from 6 miles to 25 or 38 miles in a day. I want my career to be helping people achieve fitness. I would like to work in the training and nutrition field. I have created a company for fitness and would like to give it life through this degree. I believe this scholarship will help provide the Funds I need to achieve **that goal.**”

Emily Leavins – Sketo: “My career goal at Santa Fe College is to complete the R.N. program and then obtain a B.S.N. from Santa Fe. Since my background is in helping people with addictions, trauma, depression, and the elderly, I would like to apply my knowledge and skills in a field geared toward mental healthcare and integrative care. Ultimately, I would like to have a nonprofit foundation that focuses on mental health. I understand how one's financial situation can be a barrier to treatment and healthcare, so I would like to establish a foundation that offers mental healthcare services without adding a financial burden to the patient. Simply put, I want to change my financial situation, and I want to help people in my community. I know firsthand what it is like to suffer—to be a sibling of addicts, to cover for a loved one when PTSD overwhelms him or her, even to revive a family member who has overdosed. I believe that everyone has at least one redeeming quality worth fighting for, and I want to help people find that quality.”

Diana Leon: “My educational goals are straightforward: learn everything, attain high grades, and pass all my ARDMS registry exams. After achieving my educational goals, I hope to maintain a career as a sonographer. Aside from sonography as a means of employment (and it better positioning me financially), I want to be an advocate for women. I want to provide services and expertise to forums, communities, and organizations that focus on women's health. Currently, women from all backgrounds have limited access to resources to stay healthy (mentally, physically, fiscally). I want to be out in front, helping women. In another sense, I want to be a positive female role model and part of broader, systemic change. I want to be the primary provider for my family. I want to change the discourse on women's bodies. I want women in positions **of power.**”

Our Altrusa Heritage — 1917, by Donna Johnson

(Part XIII Honoring Altrusa International's 100th Year)

In 1962 Altrusa became a charter member of the **Women's Committee, President's** Committee on Employment of the Handicapped, which gave new guidance to Altrusa Club vocational programs for the handicapped.

On July 25, 1962, to better administer its two international funding projects—Grants-in-Aid and Founders Fund Vocational Aid—Altrusa International, Inc., created the Altrusa International Foundation, Inc. This 501(c) (3) not-for-profit corporation was chartered to receive funds contributed by clubs within Altrusa International, Inc, individual Altrusans, businesses, and interested members of the general public and to administer those funds for the exclusive support of educational, scientific, literary, and charitable projects and programs. It was a farsighted decision, with potential and benefits still to be discovered.

In July 1963 the Mamie L. Bass Community Service Award (name shortened to Mamie L. Bass Service Award in July 1975.) was initiated to recognize the best in Altrusa club service projects. The first award was given at the 29th Convention held in Dallas, Texas. The first recipient was the Altrusa Club of Gadsden, Alabama.

In 1963 Altrusa achieved the following:
Organized in the Philippines.

The **President's** Committee on Employment of the Handicapped awarded Altrusa International a citation, **“in** grateful appreciation for service in behalf of our handicapped fellow **citizens.”**

Altrusa International was invited to cooperate in the **President's** Commission on the Status of Women Action Program, which added new impetus to the vocational program. Vocational Guidance Committee changed its name to Vocational Services to better portray the expanded scope of activities.

ASTRA Clubs were introduced in 1966—a new Altrusa service project to help girls between the ages of 12 and 21 (later changed to 25 on July 22, 1990) become active, involved, fulfilled members of society. ASTRA, an acronym for Ability, Service, Training, Responsibility, and Achievement, with Altrusans as sponsors and role models, provides service projects in schools and communities as its members embrace the Altrusa philosophy of serving and growing. Through the years, ASTRA members have later become Altrusans, the most notable of which is Corinne (Chee Chee) Israel, 1985–1987 International ASTRA Chairman!

On April 11, 1967, the brightest star in the Altrusa galaxy of around-the-world cities simultaneously celebrating the Golden Anniversary was Nashville, **Tennessee, Altrusa's** birthplace. Hosted by Nashville Altrusans, the day-long event began with Charter Member Natalie **Gabriel's** unveiling of a bronze plaque in the lobby of the First American National Bank building, where Altrusa was founded, and ended with the Golden Anniversary Banquet for 325 Altrusa leaders, local dignitaries, and heads of other major service organizations at the Hillwood Country Club. Minnie Pearl, of country music fame, underscored **Altrusa's** Nashville beginnings as the **evening's** featured entertainer.

This same celebration spirit permeated the 50th Golden Anniversary Convention at Miami Beach, Florida, the following July, and caused Altrusans to discuss forces creating great change in the decades which lay ahead. Aviation, with soon-to-come jumbo jets that could fly 500 people at a time, and the new marvels of communication were viewed as exciting vehicles for bringing people into closer relationship. The early goal to **“build** understanding among people of all **nations”** seemed all the more attainable in 1967.
