


Days for Girls

Because of the positive environmental changes going on throughout the world to reduce plastic usage, Days for Girls International (DFGI) needs us to switch from using plastic ziploc bags in the kits to PUL (polyurethane laminate) based transport bags.

So <u>we do not need any more ziploc freezer bags</u>. We are supposed to be fully transitioned by March 1, 2020. We will start making PUL transport bags as soon as possible. Fortunately, our sewing experts already know how to do this. We hope they can start showing us all how to do this soon.



The DGFI Transport Bag is Required in Kenya, Tanzania, Malawi, Pakistan, Panama, Botswana, Vanuatu, and the Pacific Region.

Several Altrusans attended the Friends of Susan B. Anthony (FoSBA) luncheon on Saturday, August 24th, an annual celebration of Women's Equality Day. Long time community activist Shirley Bloodworth received the annual FoSBA Award for her work with many organizations, much of which has been related to senior issues.

Professor Ann Christiano, Director and Frank Karel Chair in Public Interest Communications, Department of Public Relations at the University of Florida, was the featured speaker. Her presentation, "Women and the Media: Let's Tell the Real Stories About How Change Happens," discussed how Susan B. Anthony and Elizabeth Cady Stanton became the famous faces of women's suffrage. She then delved deeper into the less well-known stories of how several women of color worked with determination and savvy to fight for the rights of black women and men. 

ASTRA has planned the menu and will execute the meal, and Altrusa will be providing the recipes and ingredients.


