

# GRANTS SERVICE PROJECT AND APPLICATION GUIDELINES FOR DISTRICT THREE ALTRUSA CLUBS

#### Eligibility

Altrusa District Three Foundation offers grants to help District Three Altrusa Clubs with their group service projects in their local communities. Amounts of up to \$500.00 may be requested.

Altrusa District Three Foundation will award grants only once to a given project; however, a District grant may be given for a project previously receiving an International Foundation grant. After receiving a District Three Foundation grant, a club must skip at least one year before applying for another grant.

Grant applications must be received by January 31 each year. Grants are awarded at the Foundation Luncheon held during the District Three Conference.

#### **Application Format**

The grant packet must be submitted electronically in either a Word document or as an Adobe pdf file.

All entries are to be typed and double spaced.

The entry must be completed and assembled as follows:
