The Cassie S. Dollar Rehabilitative Service Award is a District Three Foundation Service Award. established by Altrusa International of Atlanta, GA, Inc. in 1999.

WHEREAS, the Altrusa International of Atlanta, GA, Inc. wanting to honor and celebrate member Cassie S. Dollar on the occasion of her 90th birthday and her 40 years as an Altrusan: and

WHEREAS, Cassie S. Dollar's professional life was spent in the rehabilitation industry making and fitting corrective supports for individuals with birth defects and medical problems; and

WHEREAS, Cassie S. Dollar exemplifies Mamie L. Bass's 2nd principle that "Altrusa is a search for the best in character, in business and in citizenship";

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the members of the Altrusa International, Inc. of Atlanta, GA wanting to encourage each club's participation in rehabilitative services in their communities, establish the Cassie S. Dollar Rehabilitative Service Award.

Objectives (submitted projects must meet the following objectives):

- To encourage clubs in their service goals to assist individuals or a group of people who are in need of rehabilitative services to enhance their quality of life in a variety of ways.
- To encourage clubs to actively seek out needs in their community for this assistance.
- To encourage clubs to develop innovative approaches to meeting rehabilitative service needs in their community in the true spirit of altruism.

Projects eligible for consideration for this award

Rehabilitative service projects are intended to enhance the quality of life for an individual or group. Following are examples but not limited to these specific projects that will be considered:

- Constructing a ramp to allow easier access in and out of a building
- Training, purchase, support of a service animal
- Assistive learning devices or programs for visually, hearing, neurological, social, or physical impairment or learning difficulties which could include computer software or equipment
- Assistive and self-help devices of a medical nature such as limb prostheses, orthotics or to help with activities of daily living

Projects that are primarily of an educational or training nature are ineligible under the rehabilitative service award.

Eligibility

Each club in District Three is eligible each year to enter its annual Rehabilitative Services project, outlining its goals and activities for the calendar year just ended as long as the project:

- Has not been submitted for consideration for any other District Three Foundation Award at the same time and
- Conducted in its entirety during the 12-month period ended prior to the date of submission of entries for judging; or
- Completed on or before the date of submission of entries for judging; or
- Clubs with projects of an ongoing nature may submit those major activities conducted during the 12-month period ended prior to the date of submission of entries.

Projects that are primarily fund-raising projects or which generate funds for club use are NOT eligible to be entered. In addition, the project is no longer eligible for this award if the same project has received the first place award previously. This provision is not meant to exclude on-going projects, but is to encourage clubs to build on previous success by expanding their programs and offering new services.

Presentation

The award packet must be submitted electronically. Please follow all the requirements for the award submission. Failure to do so will disqualify the entry.

The entry is to be completed and assembled in the following manner: The **first page** should appear as follows:

- The **second page** will be the Entry Form with all the required information.
- The **third page** will be the narrative describing the service project. It **must not exceed 500 words** on one side only of plain white paper. In developing the narrative, clubs should refer to the judging criteria and the score sheet.
- The fourth page will be any pictures or articles you may have.
- · The fifth page will be the Judging Criteria and Score Sheet.

- · Clubs submit entries on or before January 31st of each year to the person specified by the District Three Foundation Board of Directors. Award submissions mailed to anyone other than the person identified on the Awards Criteria Letter will not be forwarded and will not be judged.
- · Award entries that substantially deviate from the set criteria will not be judged.

Evaluation Committee

The District Three Foundation Board of Directors serves as the Cassie S. Dollar Rehabilitative Service Award committee and appoints three (3) prominent members of the general public to serve as judges.

Awards

The name of the winning entry will be kept confidential until the award is presented at the District Three Conference.

The first-place winner will receive a check in the amount of the interest earned on the principle of the Cassie S. Dollar Rehabilitative Service Award account each year, as off February 28-29. This money is to be used by the Club to further their service projects.

Judging Criteria

The judges may disqualify any entry for violating any rule of entry.

In evaluating entries, the judges will place primary importance on the narrative. Substantiating materials will be considered only in a supplementary perspective.

The amount of funds expended on an activity will not play a prominent role in selecting the award winners nor will the number of individuals helped, as a rehabilitative project may only assist a single individual but make an enormous difference in his or her life.

In selecting award winner, the judges will take into consideration the selection, development, implementation and evaluation of the service project. Questions are listed under the criteria to aid judges in evaluating the components of the service project. These questions are not all-inclusive, but are intended as a guide in applying the judging criteria. The clubs can use the judging criteria and score sheet as a guideline for action, from beginning to end, of the service project.
