Close to a year later, the new club received its Charter on February 10th, 1978. Hundreds of projects that made a difference in our community have been completed over the years. A sample of our current projects includes grants for teachers and classrooms to improve literacy and education outcomes for student; the Juanita Cunningham bookshelf located at Tools4Teachers that is stocked with books for public school instructors; the Nancy Jones Eyeglasses for Children program that purchases glasses for low-income children; a shoe drive for students at the College Park Partnership school for children who can't afford new shoes; and many more. The club also sponsors two Astra Clubs at local high schools, has established several Little Free Libraries, and installed Born Learning Trails.

Funding for projects is generated by Altrusa of Ocala's signature event, Trivia Night. Teams compete for bragging rights and to win baskets of books for their favorite elementary or middle school. Adding to the fun (and profitability), club members donate silent auction items and themed baskets that are awarded through drawings. Plans are already in place for the 8th annual Trivia Night in 2024.




