






Reading Recommendation

The Measure by Nikki Erlick

"The great American write Ralph Waldo Emerson wrote, 'It is not the length of life, but the depth of life.' You don't need a long lifetime to make an impact on this world. You just need the will to do so." – Nikki Erlick *The Measure*

One morning everyone, everywhere in the world, wakes up to find a small wooden box on their door step. Inside each box lies a string. Soon it is evident the length of the string corresponds to each individual's life span. This novel follows eight diverse characters and they grapple with profound questions about fate, choice and the value of time.



The novel also delves into broader societal impacts such as discrimination based on string length, political exploitation and individual choice – who can be required to open their box? Can you open your spouses' box? Your adult child's box? Not everyone wants to see or measure their string.

This novel prompts many questions- such as if you knew how much time you had left, how would you choose to live? *The Measure* is a through provoking book for book clubs and discussion groups.
